
University faculty and administrators received a total of 124 grants totaling \$22,662,593 during the 2016-17 academic year. The grants addressed a variety of issues in the community including training and education, research, project assessment and direct services. Some of the top units to receive funding include the School of Medicine, the Kent School of Social Work, College of Education and Human Development (CEHD), and the Speed School of Engineering. Of the total amount awarded \$2,767,657 either directly or indirectly the Signature Partnership Initiative area of west Louisville.
