


GRANTS RELATED TO COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT


estimated amount of grants related to community engagement reported in the 2020-21 academic year



University faculty and administrators received grant awards related to community engagement estimated at \$53,715,980 during the 2020-21 academic year. The grants addressed a variety of issues in the community including training and education, research, project assessment and direct services to communities, with a significant amount for response to the COVID-19 epidemic. Some of the top units to receive funding include the School of Medicine, College of Education and Human Development (CEHD), the School of Engineering, the School of Social Work, and the School of Dentistry.

Grants related to COVID-19

School of Medicine faculty secured over 16 million dollars of grants related to community engagement and the response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Activities included studies of wastewater and community infection prevalence, regional trainings, pandemic-related product development, and immunizations, among other examples of engaged scholarship. The School of Public Health and Information Sciences also had two grants related to COVID-19 and the community, one looking at hospitalization and death in Louisville, and one with the Center on Trauma and Children.
